W.A. Fraser Middle Vice-Principal's Message



February might be the shortest month of the year, but it was certainly still a busy one when it comes to learning at Fraser Middle. The staff and students on campus spent their days exploring competencies and developing understanding in some interesting ways. One such example was Pod D's collaborative giant dream catcher project. After studying a series of short stories written by Indigenous authors, the grade 8 students and their teachers collaborated with local and district experts to translate some of their learning into an experiential dreamcatcher activity. It was wonderful to see so many layers of collaboration coming together in support of such a great learning experience.

Another interesting highlight was Pod G's cardboard arcade. By integrating a science unit on Newton's laws of motion with some hands-on and homemade materials, the students were able to develop and create their own functional cardboard arcade. This demonstration of learning included a variety of neat creations including crane machines, wack-a-mole and other arcade stations designed and developed by the students to reflect their scientific understandings.

February was filled with many other neat projects as well. From our art show contest and a school-wide presentation of Yale's musical 'Frozen' to the proud conclusion of a basketball season filled with hard-earned successes, its been a busy February. But just like the snow, the days have melted away and now we find ourselves on the eve of spring break and shifting into a season of new growth.

After spring break, Fraser Middle school will be starting our third and final term of the academic school year. It's the final stretch! 




Anti Bullying Posters by POD 8C

Sto:lo Tools and Implements

During our Socials unit in Pod E7 we had the wonderful opportunity to work with your Indigenous department, and discover what tools were vital to our local Sto:lo people. In this workshop, we had the opportunity to not only hear from our Indigenous Support Worker Ms. Nahane as well was our Indigenous Student teacher Mr. Williams. They shared 12 tools such as a Hand Drill, D-Adze and Bone Needle. Students got to have hands on experiences with these tools and it transported the class back into our local histories. It was a wonderful opportunity of learning and gave the student hands on experience.

Canadian Archeology

Pod D7 Social Studies students have prepared presentations on a Canadian archaeology show, "Wild Archaeology." Students reviewed artifacts found as they discussed Indigenous connections to the sites across Canada. Groups ran activities after showing their 20 minute episodes such as mini digs, Playdough sculptures, Kahoots, trivia games, 4-corner activities, paper airplane competitions, puzzles, Pictionary and more. The collaboration and creativity put into these presentations were engaging for their peers and led to new understanding for everyone.








Computer - Option 2
