# **OPEN FLOOR**

**Canteen:** Aiyda hoping we can promote it more, orders are way down. She is hoping it can be shared more on social media by the school and PAC.

Brought up that it is quite costly, and that Clayburn Middle is offering things at much lower costs.

Brought up that some of the foods offered at our canteen are maybe not geared for middle school kids, maybe need to simplify.

Principal stated that it is not a staff position but a unionized position, and that the canteen used to lose a significant amount of money. After Covid it was at risk for being shut down permanently. He works closely with Aiyda to ensure following district guidelines etc. and that they are at least breaking even. **IT IS NOT FOR PROFIT.** He will talk to her about looking at what we are offering and the pricing.

Principal also brought up that the number of students who are on the district food program has increased from 5-6 students to over 30. That may be impacting canteen as well.

**Website:** Issues with the website since being updated brought up. Kinks are still being worked out. Hoping to see the daily announcements come back as they are very helpful to parents.

**New picnic tables:** They are wobbly. Principal is aware and they are just waiting for some longer bolts to be installed.
